Guest Workshop Teacher - Ward Fleri

Ward Fleri started Scottish Country Dancing in 1982 in the Bay Area. A few weeks later his company transferred him to San Diego where he has lived ever since. He attended Summer School in St. Andrews in 1984 and 1986 to earn his Preliminary Pass and Full Teacher Certificate. He started teaching San Diego Branch classes in 1984 and started a class at the University of California San Diego in 1987, which he taught for several years. Since 2005, he has been the regular teacher of the Branch's Friday night intermediate class. For the past few years, he has been a trainer for the RSCDS Core Training for Instructors (CTI) program. He currently has four trainees, including three from the Houston Branch.



In addition to teaching, Ward has served in many positions in the San Diego branch, including 12 years as Branch Chair and 13 years as Dance Director. He chaired the first three Southern California regional weekend workshops. He joined the Executive Committee of the Scottish Country Dance Teachers Association, Canada (TAC) in 2020 and was in charge of the 2022 and 2023 TAC Summer Schools in Halifax and St. Catharines. He is currently the TAC Chair.

Ward grew up on Long Island, attended Williams College, and earned a Ph.D. in Applied Mathematics at Brown University. During his career, he has worked in paleoclimatology, reservoir engineering, aerospace, and bioinformatics. He retired in 2018. Ward met his wife-to-be, Cynthia, at a Los Angeles Branch dance in October 1982. They celebrate their 40th wedding anniversary this June. They have an adult daughter and two grandkids who live in Oregon.
